## MFRP Board of Directors' Meeting 14 September 2017 Bemidji, Minnesota

The meeting was called to order by Acting Chair Bob Milne at 10:05 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

The Antitrust Statement was read by Kathleen Preece. Acting Chair Bob Milne welcomed the board and guests to the Greater Bemidji Board Room. He and Kathleen Preece gave a review of the day's meeting and field trip.

Minutes from the June 2017 Board of Directors' meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Craig Halla, second by Dennis Thompson to approve the minutes. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Acting Treasurer Dennis Thompson gave the Financial Report. He noted that the MFRP checking account balance stood at \$28,459.89, of which \$1,521.52 rested in the Ash Diversification Account. He reminded the board that the executive committee had committed \$2,500 of the ADC dollars to the emerald ash borer conference that was held in July. He updated the balance in the account 'to the minute,' which included approval by the MFRP Executive Committee of expenditures of \$854.84 for the September 14 meeting, leaving a balance of \$26,083.53.

Dennis Thompson said that assessments were up-to-date, except for Becker County; he reminded the board that the Forest Service would be billed for its second half 2017 assessment in October. He said the board expected an approximate \$18,000 carryover into 2019.

Board member Mike Kilgore questioned the carryover budget, asking how much was traditionally carried over. The executive committee explained its reluctance to carry a substantial amount over each year and that it had discussed the appropriateness of an approximate \$10,000-15,000 carryover in the past.

Bob Milne then suggested changes in the agenda, noting that Presenter Adam Murkowski could be better accommodated by a late morning presentation. Dale Krystosek agreed to begin the morning's presentations.
